Economic Impact Analysis

- Impact analysis typically uses jobs and wages as a way to evaluate the impacts associated with a specific project or activity
- Construction impacts are "temporary" in nature
 - When the project is completed, the impacts cease
- Operational impacts are ongoing, and can be estimated for a given period of time
 - Usually calculated for a year
 - Can vary from year-to-year

Types of Economic Impacts

Direct Impacts – Jobs and wages attributed directly to the economic entity being evaluated

Indirect Impacts – Impacts based on the spending by the economic entity for goods and services in the regional marketplace, such as landscaping services, advertising, professional services, etc.

Induced Impacts – Those impacts which occur as a result of employees spending their salary/wages in the regional economy for things like food, housing, entertainment, vehicles, etc.

Common Options for Estimating Economic Impacts

RIMS-II

- US Bureau of Economic Analysis
- Least expensive, lowest level of detail

IMPLAN

- Private sector group
- Moderately priced, higher level of detail

REMI

- Private sector
- Highest price, highest level of detail

Grand Sky Economic Impacts from Construction

- \$53 million in construction activity through 2016
 - \$38 million in buildings for two main tenants
 - \$15.5 million in infrastructure projects

Grand Sky Economic Impacts from Ongoing Operations

- Two large tenants plus several smaller organizations operate at Grand Sky
 - Northrop Grumman and General Atomics are anchor tenants
 - Each built the own facilities with their own capital
 - Both are expanding their presence at Grand Sky
- Number of indirect and induced jobs exceed direct employment (1.1)

Example Impacts of a Droneport

- Key Assumptions
 - 6 direct employees
 - Approximately \$900,000 in economic activity
 - Assumes 2,000 visitor days for training
 - \$300,000 in hotels
 - \$175,000 in food service and entertainment
 - \$5 million in construction/ development for the facility
 - Commercial facility
 - No significant off-site infrastructure required
 - Uses IMPLAN to estimate impacts

Impacts of \$5 Million Construction Project

- 36 direct jobs and \$2.3 million in labor income
- 17 indirect and induced jobs
- \$770,000 in indirect and induced wages

Operational Impacts of a Droneport

- 13 direct jobs and \$434,000 in direct wages
- 8 indirect and induced jobs
- \$362,000 indirect and induced wages
